


Group versus Individual Registration









We also asked the 6 non-members the reason why they are not part of the EACVI.



80% of respondents selected the answer "Yes and I am pleased with these services."







The top 4 topics as the first choice and the total ranking (including the 5 choices) are the same, the assessment of haemodynamics encounter a larger success in the first choice selection than in the total ranking of the 5 choices.

EuroEcho-Imaging, enlarged its scope to cover all imaging modalities, Echocardiography, CMR and NC and Cardiac CT. In order to measure the impact for the audience, the survey included a question about the topic they are most interested in. (Several responses possible)




97% of the audience that responded to the survey are most interested in Echocardiography. 14 of the respondents choose CMR, and only 3 people selected the Nuclear Cardiology and Cardiac CT. These results show that efforts need to be maintained to obtain a more balanced Imaging congress. The scientific content included more sessions about these 2 topics this year. The following graph presents the level of satisfaction with these new sessions:




More than 3/4 of the respondents are "very satisfied" or "quite satisfied" with the new arrangements in the scientific programme offering more sessions about CMR and Nuclear Cardiology and Cardiac CT. 7% of respondents were not satisfied, and only 17% said that they are not interested in these topics.

Overall scientific satisfaction



The overall scientific programme was praised by respondents with a high level of satisfaction: **95% of "Good" and "Excellent"** answers were regarding the programme. The graph above shows the satisfaction with the Agora, the session schedule, Imaging Campus sessions and the EACVI young programme. The enthusiasm is lower for the Scientific Programme, the **"Excellent" answers are from 23-29%** of responses and **"Good" represent 41 to 63%** of the answers.

Finally the Posters and Exhibition content encountered a large success, even if the number of "Excellent" answers was lower, with a 75% share of the responses.




The sessions that obtained the highest level of satisfaction are the how-to sessions and teaching courses, the value perception here is that the new learning that can be easily implemented upon their return, straight into their normal daily activities.



Scientific resources


Less than half of the respondents used the e-Library, from these 49% of users, 45% were satisfied or very satisfied. 2% were dissatisfied and 2% were very dissatisfied. 
The same question was asked concerning the Mobile app and the awareness is much higher, only **6% did not know about it** (14% cannot use it as they don't have the adapted device). **Only 1 respondent found the app quite dissatisfying, all the other users were either satisfied or very satisfied.** The EuroEcho-Imaging mobile app obtained a very high level of satisfaction overall.



Customer retention



The questions above measure the value perception of the EuroEcho-Imaging Congress for respondents and the key benefits it offers them; 70% answered "knowledge", 49% "latest updates in my specialty" and 43% "Improvements for my daily practice". These are in line with the scientific programme level of satisfaction. The networking opportunities are mentioned by more than a 1/4 of the respondents. As for the ESC Congress the graph above shows the impact of the destination, 10% of respondents mentioned their memories from the city as a key benefit. And 9% mentioned the CME accreditation.



Finally, the question on their intention to attend the Congress next year also illustrates the high level of quality and satisfaction of the participants as 56% said "Yes."

As for every congress it may be too early for a large part of them to already know whether they would be allowed to attend the following year. Here the results are 43% answers "I don't know" and 2% answers "No".



Overview of the congress website, from 13 December 2013 until 02 December 2014



On the congress website, we notice that the first peaks in April and May coincide with the promotion of the abstracts submission and its deadline. In October, the peak highlights the late registration deadline.


Pageviews on the Abstract submission homepage






