





* Registration origin: Group versus Individual




Group registration: 5 or more participants under one account, industry, agency or institution.









D. Mobile App

Promotion of the mobile app

In order to obtain a large number of downloads and to anticipate Wi-Fi issues on-site, the app was widely promoted before the congress started. This early launch allowed delegates to test the mobile app functionalities, and prepare their attendance and schedule before arriving in Seville. The mobile app web page was launched on **9 June** (~6 months before the congress starts.)

A **dedicated webpage** promoting the mobile app was launched on 11 June; this web page gave delegates the keys to easily download the app. This web page promotes the mobile app functionalities and the process for them. Based on Google Analytics, from 11 June to 2 December this page obtained **2 610 views**, from 2 to 5 December this page obtained **464 views**. (4 times less than 2014 and equivalent to 2013).

This mobile app was also promoted on the different emailing campaigns sent promoting EuroEcho-Imaging 2015.

A few tweets were also sent to promote the EuroEcho 2015 mobile app

The **first announcement** flyer was made available during EuroEcho-Imaging 2014 but the promotion of the mobile app appears only on the second version which was available in June 2015 for ASE Congress. A total of 700 first announcement flyers were distributed through the different congresses organised by the ESC or not.

The EuroEcho-Imaging 2015 leaflet was a document created to promote the **Advance Programme.** All programmes were available electronically, this leaflet was given to delegates attending other congresses to provide them with information about the congress, make them register and download the app on their mobile devices. Overall 2000 flyers were printed and a total of 1 284 Advance Programmes were distributed through the different congresses organised by the ESC or not.

The mobile app was promoted in different ways during the congress:

- On delegate's badge
- In the Final Programme (available online on 12 November 4 150 global views) and given to all delegates
- On the Industry Programme given to all delegates
- On totems
- On slideshows during intersession and on EACVI-ESC stand
- On the Congress news

Download figures

There were a total of 3 136 participants at EuroEcho-Imaging 2015 (-3% compared to 2014). The EuroEcho-Imaging 2015 Mobile App was downloaded <u>2 772 times</u> (from 9 June until 11 December, -5% compared to 2014).


Note: this does not mean that exactly all of congresses delegates downloaded the app, as some users may have downloaded the app on several devices (e.g. a mobile phone and a tablet).

Since the app is free to download and free to be used without registration, it could have been downloaded by persons not attending the congress. This is something to consider.


We can imagine that these figures are related to the earlier launch of the mobile app, and the intensive promotion about this, but we should also include the delegates' profile and their interest in new technologies.

Downloads per iPhones and iPads (1 884 downloads in total) were largely used by our audience. <u>68% of downloads</u> were on iOS devices. (equivalent to 2014)

One can notice that the figures are quite the same between 2014 and 2015 and there is a slight increase in the proportion of downloads before the congress. The majority of the users have downloaded the app before the congress: promotion campaign has worked.

Downloads per language

The language information gives an indication about the demographics of the users. It reflects the language setting on the device of the user (but not in which countries the app was downloaded, or where these people were coming from).



The top 5 of downloading languages has slightly changed as it is influenced by the hosting country: Spanish pops from 6^{th} to 2^{nd} position (+3%), Portuguese from 8^{th} to 7^{th} (+2%) while German drops from 3^{rd} to 5^{th} position (-1%).

This top 10 is quite different from the top 10 "registration" countries which are: UK, Spain, Greece, Italy, Netherlands, Belgium, Poland, Romania, France and Bulgaria.

Users per day

The following chart presents the number of users of the app per day.



One can see the impact of News sent to the mobile app users and their interest in some News more than others.

On the most intensive day, 2 December 2015 (Day 1), the app was used by almost **1 491** professionals, which represents 48% of the delegates.

In 2014 the most intensive day was on 3 December 2014 (Day 1) and the app was used by 1 625 professionals (56% of the 2014 delegates).

❖ What we have learned

- 80% of users had downloaded the app before the congress but there were less downloads than in 2014. We advise to improve the promotion.
- Users are interested mainly in browsing the scientific content and preparing their attendance. They also look for information on the congress itself.
- Most of the important functionalities of the app are better used (the number of hits per user has increased): Daily Schedule, My Congress and floor plans.





On the congress section, we notice that the first peaks in April and May coincide with the promotion of the abstracts submission and its deadline. Overall


traffic is increased during summer due to early fee promotion. In October, the peak highlights the late registration deadline and the traffic gradually increases during November due to the proximity of the Congress

Pageviews over time for the Abstract submission section (Call for science) from the launch of escardio 3 to one day prior to the congress (9 April 2015 – 1 December 2015)













6.Post congress survey

6.1 Introduction

This survey was sent to all EuroEcho-Imaging 2015 congress participants, all EACVI members and all past participants to EuroEcho-Imaging in 2014 and in 2013, 4 702 emails were sent.

165 surveys were completed representing 3.5% of participation.

However this survey was aimed at EuroEcho-Imaging 2015 congress participants (2 775 delegates) and the response rate is **6%**, last year the post congress survey response rate was 4%.

This response rate is lower than other ESC sub-specialty congresses, but this was also the case for EuroEcho-Imaging 2014. It may be explained by the period of time, EuroEcho-Imaging is held early December, the audience targeted in this survey may receive all wishes for the New Year and they may not have time to fulfil the survey. In total 2 push notifications were sent in the mobile app inviting them to fill in the survey.

As a comparison this year 9% of the EHRA EUROPACE Cardiostim audience completed the survey (based on 2360 emails sent and 220 surveys replied.) And Heart Failure obtained a response rate of 11%. (Based on 2275 emails sent and 251 surveys replied.)


In order to increase the response rate up to 10%, it could be interesting to investigate the possibility to send the survey during the congress with the daily congress news to allow a better response rate.

The survey was sent on Monday 7 December, 2 days after the congress. The results have been grouped into 2 different parts, respondents' profile and respondents' congress' satisfaction.


6.2 Respondents' profile

Respondents' profile is one of the most important elements to understand the audience. This is important to offer them the best services for EuroEcho-Imaging in 2016. This survey treated the customer expertise, their top 3 topics, and their involvement with EACVI.

A. Respondents' expertise and topic



Respondents' expertise shows that 100% of the audience (people who answered the survey) felt expert in Echocardiography. This strong result illustrates the need to maintain a strong promotion of the Echocardiography content in the scientific programme.



156 answers 3 topics to choose


EuroEcho-Imaging should focus promotion and efforts on the most important topics presented here. Heart Valves and Cardiomyopathies were selected in the top 3 answers by more than 40% of the respondents. These results can be linked to this year's congress' main theme.

EuroEcho-Imaging congress is trying to develop its programme to include more Cardiac CT and Nuclear cardiology or CMR topics but these do not seem to be in the respondent's favourite topics.

The scientific programme should reflect the respondent needs and focus on echocardiography.

The other topics are not necessarily defined in the top 3 most interesting topics but they are of interest to the attendees.

B. Respondents involvement with EACVI




39% of respondents said they attended also EuroEcho-Imaging in 2014.

58% of respondents said they were EACVI members; this figure is really different from last year results. (94% of the respondents are member of the EACVI in 2014).

This is not linked to a drop in EACVI member attendance, as the percentage of EACVI members grown from 33.8% in 2014 to 39.2% in 2015.

This figure shows that also non members responded to this survey. It gives us an indication of the profile who answered the survey, more in line with the overall EuroEcho-Imaging 2015 attendance.

People who said 'No' at the previous question: "Were you an EACVI member in 2015?" were asked the reason why they were not members.




The sample is not really high as it is the selection of people who answered 'No' to the previous question "Were you an EACVI member in 2015" and it represent 58 answers.

38% of these respondents (22 people) said the membership was too expensive.

EACVI need to focus efforts on the value perceived in order to reduce the number of non-members due to their price perception compared to the benefit received.

Also, the second reason for not being a member of EACVI is that they are already member of another organisation. This result illustrates the competition EACVI is facing regarding membership.

The value perception needs to be reinforced in order to convert them into EACVI members. As well as for those who perceived the benefits offered not attractive enough.



There is an opportunity as 19% of these respondents didn't know thay they could be member of the Association.

Those who replies "Yes" to the question are you an EACVI member, were asked: if they were aware of the exclusive services they can benefit from their membership.


85% of the respondents based on 91 replies, are aware and happy with these benefits.

12% of the respondents do not use the services, it could be interesting to know if they do not use them because they think it's not useful or because, they do not value these benefits. This could potentially be a threat for EACVI to loose these members.

3% of the EACVI members were not aware of these benefits, that means, they become EACVI members for other reasons. It could be interresting to understand what were the key factors in their decision to become an EACVI member.

This year the new membership offer was launched at EuroEcho-Imaging 2015. The graphic here under presents the respondents knowledge about this new membership. 67% of respondents said they already became or will register online to become an EACVI member with the new benefits. 18.7% agrees to receive information about this new membership. We should make sure that these delegates are included in future EACVI membership campaigns.

14.2% of respondents said, they are not interrested in this new membership offer.




In this first part, the report presented the respondent audience; their topic of expertise and their top 3 topics of interest. This part presented also the respondents' involvement with EACVI, and the reasons why they decided not to join, the EACVI membership benefits and the new offer for 2016.

6.3 Respondents' congress satisfaction

The second part will treat the congress satisfaction including the congress resources, the logistical elements such as the location and time. Finally, this report will present the stand and delegates services satisfaction.

A. Overall satisfaction




The overall satisfaction is good; the satisfaction regarding the scientific programme is 73% of satisfied answers. Last year the question was differently organised with 5 levels of satisfaction/dissatisfaction and the result was much more positive as 94% of the respondent thought the scientific programme was excellent or good. This drop can be a satisfaction decrease but can also be linked to the question, if respondents are less enthusiastic they would say "good" last year and maybe "average" this year.

The "Congress organisation" as well as the "range of topics covered" are appreciated by respondents as they respectively obtained 69% and 67% of satisfied answered. Whereas the stand, exhibition and posters obtained a lower level of satisfaction with 57%, 51% and 43% of satisfied.

These elements were not included in last year's survey so we cannot compare these figures, but these 3 elements are directly linked to the customer care, the support offered to them on the stand, in the exhibition area, these are necessary to increase the value perception of delegates; it's directly linked to their congress experience.

B. Scientific Resources satisfaction




The EuroEcho-Imaging 2015 mobile app encounter a large success to the audience as it was downloaded 2 772 times.

52% of the respondents said that the mobile app suits their need to consult the scientific programme.

28% still use the printed final programme. As illustrated in previous congress market research the printed programme is kept as a tangible souvenir of their congress experience. Maybe a hybrid version of the programme between the actual printed final programme and the programme at a glance could be investigated.


It's also interesting to note that 20% use both materials, print copy of programme at a glance and the mobile app.



The Industry programme was created to separate the scientific pre-arranged and abstract based programme with the Industry Sponsored sessions, satellite symposia, exhibition area and other related promotion and information. In order to maintain the interest for this programme, a note pad was also included. Here the graph shows that 40% of the respondents do not read it at all, 29% only used the note pad and 31% used it properly.

69% of the respondents are not using the Industry Programme properly; there is a need to re-align this product with the congress attendees needs.


C. Destination and time satisfaction



Past congress market research and surveys, shows that the location of the congress is also an important element in the delegates decision to attend. Sometimes, they extend their stay for holidays.

52% of the respondents are looking for destinations easy to access with regular flights, 24% are looking for destination with affordable prices for rooms, transportation and catering. 24% are also interested in the city itself these may be interested in extending their journey for holidays.

These answers gave also an indication on the profile of the respondents.




Previous post congress surveys made for subspecialty congresses illustrate the impact of the location in the registration figures.

The question regarding the future destination wish highlights the attraction for Southern Europe (55% of the respondents choose Southern Europe countries).

The interest for Southern countries is not directly linked to the country of registrants.

This may be linked to the period of time of the congress. This is the next question.

Every year, EuroEcho-Imaging is held the first week of December, the question was asked to the audience to understand if there is another most suitable time to organise the congress.



December was the top 1 answer that means the respondents are happy with this period.

23% of respondents would like to have the congress held in November. It would be interesting to better understand the profile of these respondents and the reasons why they prefer November.

Another month mentioned by more than 10% of the respondents is May, this answer may be linked to the fact that most of the Sub-Specialty Congresses organised by the ESC are held in May.

Appendix 1: EuroEcho-Imaging 2015 Mobile App Report

1. Introduction

A. EuroEcho 2015 Mobile App

As in 2014, EuroEcho 2015 mobile app was launched earlier, in order to be live during ASE congress in June. Also, for those who downloaded the app earlier they could test the functionalities to make the most of this congress app. This opportunity allows us to enter in the personal healthcare professional device 6 months before the congress starts and send more push notifications.

An upgraded version of the EuroEcho-Imaging Mobile App (for iPhones, Android Phones, iPad & Android tablets) was made available on the App Store and Google Play. This mobile app was delivered on the new platform.



The mobile app contained:

- ✓ The entire scientific programme of the Congress (including abstracts & learning objectives)
- ✓ Congress floor-plans (congress venue and exhibition)









3. EuroEcho 2015 Mobile App Figures

A. General metrics

There were a total of 3 136 participants at EuroEcho-Imaging 2015 (-3%). The EuroEcho-Imaging 2015 Mobile App was downloaded <u>2 772 times</u> (from 9 June until 11 December, -5% compared to 2014).

Note: this does not mean that exactly all of congresses delegates downloaded the app, as some users may have downloaded the app on several devices (e.g. a mobile phone and a tablet).


Since the app is free to download and free to be used without registration, it could have been downloaded by persons not attending the congress. This is something to consider.

We can imagine that these figures are related to the earlier launch of the mobile app, and the intensive promotion about this, but we should also include the delegates' profile and their interest in new technologies.

B. Downloads per platform



One can notice that the figures are quite the same between 2014 and 2015 and there is a slight increase in the proportion of downloads before the congress. The majority of the users has downloaded the app before the congress: promotion campaign has worked.

Downloads per language

The language information gives an indication about the demographics of the users. It reflects the language setting on the device of the user (but not in which countries the app was downloaded, or where these people were coming from).



The top 5 of downloading languages has slightly changed as it is influenced by the hosting country: Spanish pops from 6^{th} to 2^{nd} position (+3%), Portuguese from 8^{th} to 7^{th} (+2%) while German drops from 3^{rd} to 5^{th} position (-1%).

This top 10 is quite different from the top 10 "registration" countries which is: UK, Spain, Greece, Italy, Netherlands, Belgium, Poland, Romania, France and Bulgaria.

Users per day

The following chart presents the number of users of the app per day.



One can see the impact of News sent to the mobile app users and their interest in some News more than others.

On the most intensive day, 2nd December (Day 1), the app was used by almost **1 491** professionals who represent 48% of the delegates.

In 2014, the most intensive day was on 3rd December (Day 1) and the app was used by 1 625 professionals (56% of the 2014 delegates).

What we have learnt

80% of users had downloaded the app before the congress but there were less downloads than in 2014. Promotion should be improved

Users are interested mainly in browsing the Scientific content and preparing their attendance. They also look for information on the congress itself.

Most of the important functionalities of the app are better used (the number of hits per user has increased): Daily Schedule, My Congress and floorplans.
