

Submissions have nearly returned to Pre-COVID Levels (1096 in 2022 vs 1222 in 2020)

The high number of accepted withdrawn this year is explained by the exclusion of abstract submissions exclusively from Russian and/or Belarusian institutions.

2.3. Contributors

Contributors to the Programme – Overview of Invited Faculty and Presenters:

There were **742** active programme contributors from **51** countries, representing **1?175** roles.

The number of programme contributors (invited faculty and presenters combined) does not equal the total of invited faculty and presenters. 





➤ Age Scale








Stage in Career


The majority of the registrants are practicing.






Gender

The majority of the registrants are male.








