


39 sessions (including 31 pre-arranged sessions and 8 abstract based sessions) were organised around this theme.







### General Cardiology Track on Saturday

A full day programme, designed to update healthcare professionals as an introduction to ESC Congress 2014 took place on Saturday 30 August. New this year, 2 distinct tracks of 3 sessions each

- General Cardiology for Nurses and Allied Professionals (inc. One session in Spanish)
- General Cardiology for Physicians, Technicians and General Practitioners

These tracks were developed in collaboration with the Councils and local representatives

### Cardiac Anatomy & Pathology Session – LIVE Specimens Demonstration

Held this year in Room Sarajevo Village 1 – Still a very popular type of session. The room was set up with a demo stand, camera and large screen. These sessions are not available as Video on Demand (Webcast), as they do not have a presentation linked to the demonstrations.

### > The HUB in Central Village

Four round stages surrounded by plasma screens were built and used as new kind of lecture room each with a seating capacity of 250 seats (and overflow capacity of over 400 person standing).

The entire area called "the Hub" was designed to facilitate exchange and interaction between presenters, delegates and the chairpersons.

These sessions were hosted in room Brussels in Central Village, in an open room format to facilitate audience interaction and participation.

Audiovisual support included Recordings of cases, Live procedures, Video extracts.

#### Congress Spotlight: "Innovation and the Heart" $\geq$

The spotlight for ESC Congress 2014 was: "Innovation and the heart" The programme featured 39 Sessions under the track "Spotlight of the congress" (31 Sessions and 8 Abstract-based sessions).

Scientists could submit their research under the abstract Submission Option "Congress Spotlight". Two rapid fire abstract sessions were dedicated to presenting the top rated abstracts submitted in this category.

#### **Cardiologists of Tomorrow** $\succ$

A track constructed by the ESC Cardiologists of Tomorrow group, included a full day track on Monday 2 September as well as 7 Clinical cases sessions. This programme was held in "The Hubs" in central village.

For the first time Cardiovascular Scientists of Tomorrow held their own track during Sessions included key tips on the first successful grant ESC Congress 2014. application, the first paper published and importantly, opportunities to develop the next career step. A dedicated programme in Basic Science Village 2 - This track also featured a dedicated Rapid Fire Session for Young Researchers in Basic Science.

A total of 35 sessions featured this functionality.

A total of 15 330 votes were registered from the audience, an average of 57 votes per session.

Some sessions had several questions whilst other just one.

We encountered some technical difficulties to start with (in the coordination with the SSC) these were solved along the way.

We find the figures very interesting for a first try.

### Live From ESC Congress

Initiative started in 2013.

On the website <u>www.escardio.org</u>, a selection of sessions was available "Live from ESC Congress"

This initiative was promoted mid-August.

The programme featured the sessions and in addition, some ESC TV extract, Interviews, Advertisements.

In addition this year during the night time programme, we included a series of joint sessions and scheduled these at "Local DAY Time", which meant that our transcontinental "virtual" audience was able to see the joint sessions (replay) at a convenient day time for them.

### Process

Programme was accessible directly from the ESC Home page and on the dedicated page.

### **Objectives of the programme**

- Increase visibility of the ESC and ESC Congress

### Results

- 27 hours of live streaming
- 65 hours of replay night and day
- 44 188 page views on the ESC Homepage
- 8 336 page views on the dedicated page. From Sunday to Tuesday, 2 000 page views by day have been recorded









### **Abstract-Based Sessions**

A record number of **11 444 abstracts** were submitted for this year's Congress.

4 597 abstracts were presented during the 5 days of the Congress.

Accepted abstracts were presented as Featured, oral and poster presentations.

### **ORAL Abstract Presentation Sessions**

### State of the Art and Featured Research Sessions

Five of the highest rated abstracts in each topic composed these high profile sessions which concluded with a State of the Art lecture given by a key opinion leader in this field.

### "Rapid Fire" oral presentations

Held in "The Hub" in Central Village, these fast paced and interactive sessions presented key messages of ten abstracts.

### **Oral abstract presentations**

Each session was composed of six topic-related abstracts. The two Chairpersons were chosen for their expertise in the topics presented and conducted the session.

### Young Investigators Awards

Selected for the outstanding quality of their work, four Young Investigators were competing for a prestigious ESC Award and presented their original research in front of a jury.

The awards were focused on Basic Science, Clinical Science, Thrombosis, Population sciences and Coronary Pathophysiology and microcirculation (Working Group award)

The ESC granted the winner with a prize of €2 000, finalists will each received a prize of €1 000 each.

### Nursing/Allied Professional Investigator Award

This award aims to recognise significant contributions from new investigators in cardiovascular nursing and allied professions at European level.

A new layout accommodated the addition of the moderated electronic poster stations within each topic group section.

### Moderated Poster Session

### NEW Moderated ePosters

One moderated ePoster Session per topic at each Poster Session.

A total of 63 Moderated Poster Sessions (compared to 14 the previous years)

This new initiative allowed us to accommodate more abstracts in the programme and also introduce a new presentation format.

Each Topic Section of the Poster Area featured a Moderated ePoster Station –where the Moderated Poster Session were held. Official presentation was made from the large screen and during the remainder of the time; the posters were available for consultation in an ePoster Format on individual screens (no more paper display).





Each Moderated Poster Session had a winner (Best Poster Presentation) who was awarded a Diploma An overall winner for each topic was then selected amongst all these "Best Posters" and won a free Registration for ESC Congress 2015 in London. These were announced at the Highlight Session and on the website.

9 Posters were awarded at each poster session - a total of 63 Awards -These posters were identified with a Sign on the Poster board on the presentation day. Presenters were awarded a Certificate.

### POSTER DISCUSSANT



**308 Roles of Discussants /269 persons** were invited to participate in this new initiative.

Discussants were selected from either the existing Faculty list or invited in recognition for having been an abstract grader (Grader + FESC).

Discussants benefited from Free Registration even if this was their only role at the congress.

We still faced a lot of difficulties in carrying out this programme with a very high number of "no show" discussants, last minute cancellation but also on the side of the presenters, not all are at their poster at the dedicated viewing time, so the discussant can be quite annoyed by this. This programme needs to be reconsidered.

#### > Abstract Embargo

All abstracts selected for inclusion in the Press conference were placed under embargo on the website and these were not published a week prior to the congress as was done for all other abstracts.

Abstract journal supplement was made available online after all embargos were lifted (Tuesday).



### Scientific Sessions – Overview of Attendance

Based on a head count in the room by the room hostesses, we are able to have an overview of the session attendance.

NB – In this calculation, we only take into account the sessions taking place in lecture rooms. Not accounted for Poster Sessions and Moderated Poster Sessions.



### Total attendance per day

We started in 2013 to change the congress schedule and introduced more scientific sessions on Saturday and also on Tuesday afternoon.

This change of schedule was continued in 2014, with even more sesions on Saturday morning and a full programme on Tuesday afternoon.

We can see a proportionate shift in attendance.

Comparatively in 2014, with more delegates registered, our counts show less attendance in the sessions in overall numbers.

To be noted that the Moderated Poster Sessions, which represent a full programme held at coffee breaks are not counted in these figures.

### Speaker Service Centre – Self Serve Stations

Upon faculty members' arrival at the SSC for the first time (check in), a picture was taken and the technician/hostess explained how the self service process was organised. Faculty, once checked in, could access any upload station. Scanning their badge at the station gave them access to their file – containing the details of the presentation for which they would need to upload the PowerPoint.

A technician was available nearby to provide assistance with the process or with PowerPoint/ Movies/Formatting etc...

My ESC: My Agreement stations were also available at the SSC. All faculty members' had to submit agreement form/ copyrights & Declaration of Interest via My ESC in order to be able to give the lecture.

Last minute replacements / unconfirmed faculty were asked to do this at the SSC prior to uploading the presentation. This allowed us to enforce the Copyrights/DOI process without too much inconvenience to the faculty.

### Speaker Service Centre – Lounge & Working area

Also available this year at the SSC a large lounge including working area (Table & plugs) was set close to the Faculty Food & Beverage counter. This area was very busy and appreciated by the faculty. It provided a place where faculty could work on their presentation prior to uploading at the self serve stations.

### Online Upload

The online upload service opened a week prior to the congress and remained opened until Tuesday 2 Midnight.

Faculty could choose to use the Online Upload – even whilst at the congress – from their computer, via My ESC/My agreements, without coming to the Speaker Service Centre. The online service provided a step by step wizard which took the faculty through the upload process.

Successful uploads were confirmed by email. In case of a problem with the upload, a message detailing the error was sent.

The online upload process also included the Declaration of Interest Slide insertion (either automatic or personal).

For each presentation uploaded faculty received a confirmation email with the status of their upload. Presentations could be uploaded online until midnight (GMT+1) the night before the presentation was scheduled. So even while at the congress, from their hotel room or another location in the congress centre faculty could use the online upload service.

### **COPYRIGHTS & DOI**

The Declaration of Conflict of Interest and Copyrights agreements are now mandatory (for all ESC Sessions).

CYIM system provides the faculty - for each of his/her presentation - a slide pre-loaded with the DOI information submitted at the time of acceptation.

Speaker can use their own DOI slide if preferred; otherwise the automated slide is inserted.

### VIDEOS

All presentations held in the lecture rooms were webcasted.

What was not systematically available this year was the recording of the "panel discussions". We will work on developing this feature for 2015.

### OVERFLOWS

All rooms were equipped with a screen outside the lecture room to be used as Overflows Screen (if needed).

Overflows Screens are started pro-actively when the room gets busy – it may just be for one presentation – in order to avoid crowd management issues.

The table below shows how many overflow screens were in operation per day. This included overflows of Industry Sessions.

This is a good indicator to confirm that the room size reduction has not created problems for the delegates.

- 100 000 m<sup>2</sup> configured as a Main Entrance with Registration, ESC Plaza & Central Village (The Hub – Lecture room Barcelona & Brussels – The Hub), Exhibition Hall, a Press Area, 9 villages for Lecture Rooms.
- **18 800 seats** distributed between 31 lecture rooms (26 constructed by *ACS*, 5 constructed by *mediAVentures*) New this year, one more room for the HUB.
- **Exhibition** was in one main area and the ESC Plaza was located in the Main Entrance, behind the ESC Stand.

### Childcare

The access to the congress being restricted to healthcare professionals, ESC provided for the 2<sup>nd</sup> year in a row childcare service facility, for delegates to be able to leave their children at no charge while going to sessions.

# **ESC CORPORATE EXHIBITION & ACTIVITIES**

### ESC Stand

The ESC Stand was situated at the entrance to the ESC Plaza, located in the middle of the National Cardiac Society stands and opposite the Registration. This area was sandwiched between the two parts of Central Village.



The ESC stand measured 550 m<sup>2</sup>, an increase in size justified by a different layout (made necessary by specific restrictions for construction within this hall) and the inclusion of a promotional area for ESC Congress 2015. The stand included the following activities:

- Welcome Desk: for all questions relating to the ESC's products, services and activities, and Congress specific information. This turned out to be a key area for promoting ESC Congress 365.
- **Education**: specifically promoting e-learning with an ESCeL demo point, but also promoting the entire ESC offering, with a tactile screen application and paper catalogues.
- ESC Congress 2015: Promotion for next year's congress was brought onto the ESC stand again, after having a separate promotional area for the past two years. A desk was allocated to London & Partners (for information on London) and for the first time, registration for next year was open (with a discount of 100 euros for the first 100 people registering). There was a large double-sided visual of the congress, with a simulated British telephone booth, where delegates could register or take photos.



- **Shop:** sales of educational products and ESC souvenirs
- **Membership:** Area comprised a membership reception desk for general queries about membership and fixing issues in My ESC accounts, and desks dedicated to each of the 6 Associations and one dedicated to Councils and Working Groups. ESC Fellowship questions and applications were also handled at the reception desk, instead of having a dedicated space. This had already proven to be a successful method in 2013 and was even more so this year.



- **Registries** for all EurObservational Research Programme (EORP) enquiries and distribution of material outlining the programme.
- **Guidelines:** The 5 new pocket guidelines were handed out for free to ESC members and other guidelines products promoted.



- **Guidelines Download lounge:** semi-enclosed space dedicated to promotion of the guidelines mobile app. 2 to 3 staff from the supplier who created the app were on hand to explain how to download and use the app.
- **Publications:** All the necessary information for the Journals Family, on-line Journals for 2015, journal subscriptions, pre-orders of text books (which went very well) and display of all books available for sale on the shop.
- Young community: 322 Young Cardiologists were given their CoT "pack" (a congress bag with CoT logo, containing a special pin, the 5 new Pocket Guidelines, the ACCA toolkit and flyers of all the relevant young communities: COT, Club 35, Scientists of Tomorrow and the EAPCI Young Community). Representatives from the different young groups were present from time to time, to answer questions about their groups.
- **Promotion of mobile apps:** A large totem, resembling a smartphone, was used to promote all the ESC's scientific apps (ACCA toolkit, EHRA key messages, Guidelines, Journals) as well as the ESC Congress app.

• **Congresses promotion wall:** Large visuals of the posters of future Congresses were placed on one large lit exterior wall of the stand.





### Staff:

A presence of 33 stand staff: including a rotation of ESC staff on some areas and some permanently present, 9 hostesses, 2 suppliers and 1 partner representative.

### Conclusion:

The stand was ideally placed for delegate passage (being between Registration and Posters) and there was a steady flow of visitors. Saturday was extremely busy, particularly in the morning, as were the breaks on other days. Wednesday morning was much quieter, as expected. All areas were well frequented, but particularly areas such as the guidelines desk and mobile app lounge, and membership. It remains logical that the ESC Stand is with the Constituent Bodies stands and that it acts as a gateway to the congress. This should be repeated in the future, where physically possible.

Despite the size of the stand, some areas did experience a bottle neck at times, particularly when the queue for Pocket Guidelines formed. It is important to keep enough open space in between the different desks and brochure racks, so it is recommended to maintain at least the same size if not increase the space for 2015, depending on the layout and number of activities taking place.

Overall membership applications were up, but it is difficult to make a comparison with previous years, as there has been an evolution in the different categories and conditions. There was a lot of interest in Fellowship.

In general the contact with delegates was felt to have been of high quality, with pertinent and relevant questions about the ESC and about the ESC Congress and resources. Many delegates expressed their satisfaction and appreciation for the service received, as well as with the congress overall.

If possible, all ESC related corporate stands (eg. European Affairs, International Affairs) should be incorporated into the ESC Stand itself, to present a united body to our delegates. As this means expanding further, we need to look into ways we can achieve this.

### > Young Community Corner

For the second year, a young Community Corner was organised in the middle of the ESC Stand.

All the young communities of the ESC were promoted: Cardiologists of Tomorrow (CoT), Club 35 of EACVI, Young EP of EHRA, Scientists of Tomorrow of Council on Basic Cardiovascular Science (SoT), Young ACCA, Young thrombosis researchers group of the Working Group on Thrombosis, the EAPCI Young, Heart Failure Specialists of Tomorrow (HoT).

An average of 100 young delegates per day came to visit this lively stand where the different leaders of the groups were present to inform and to share their experience.

### > Education

**Brand new this year!** All Educational activities were presented **on the main ESC Stand**, on the ESC Education corner (including the ESC e-Learning platform, presented until last year on a separate booth).

The Education corner was therefore a little larger than last year to accommodate **2 plasma screens** versus 1 in the past.





All ESC Educational activities were promoted on the Education Corner, even if ESC Congress 2014 focus was on E-Learning

### ESC eLearning platform

7 Areas of Study (General Cardiology, Acute Cardiac Care, Cardiovascular Imaging, Heart Failure, Heart Rhythm, Percutaneous Interventions and Prevention & Rehabilitation) with a total of **180** courses available online and over **1000 MCQs**.

**124 Demos** of ESCeL were organised during the ESC Congress to delegates.

### • Continuing Education and Training Catalogue & Touch Screen

The **Continuing Education and Training Catalogue** was distributed to delegates and the **interactive touch screen** was available this year again for the third time, to present (and send by email) ESC Educational offering by topic.

### Other activities of the ESC Education team during congress

- The traditional bi-annual **MCQ review meeting** in general cardiology took place as scheduled, emphasising the increasing need for MCQs as ESC content repurposing and self-assessment is on the rise.
- Delivery of the EACVI TTE paper based examination within the Congress Facility (152 candidates)
- A series of **meetings** with the Education Chairman, Committee Members and when appropriate University College Cork representative to reflect namely on outcome measurement and needs assessment implementation, which are a Priority for FY 15-16.

### - ESC General Cardiology Webinar Workshop

Last years' very successful initiative was renewed in 2014.

2 Workshops were organised this year with a total of 19 participants. Andrew Spencer from Clarus Training and Facilitation Ltd **provided invited webinar speakers and hosts with tools and techniques to prepare and deliver webinars**.

## Publications

#### **Stand Activities**

Since 2009 a delegate's "Journal Choice" (EHJ or CVR) can be made online and since 2011 they can also choose their subscription format, ie. print or online.

Since Munich's ESC Congress 2012, the ESC offers delegates an online-only subscription to EHJ or CVR and those desiring the hard copy have to pay an extra fee referred to as a print top-up fee.

**20 730 delegates** will receive an online subscription to EHJ or CVR with around 92% of those for EHJ. In 2015, **522 Young Cardiologists** will receive an EHJ online subscription.



**786 delegates** logged in via one of **16** "My ESC Browser" posts implemented this year. **113 delegates** checked their address and/or journal choice online during the Congress period. The posts consisted of computers allowing delegates to access their My ESC accounts and modify/validate their information, including journal details.

A new record of over **5 500 Journals** were distributed from the ESC Stand, most of them being distributed on the first day.


The ESC Cardiovascular Medicine Textbook (2nd edition); ESC Textbook on Intensive and Acute Cardiac Care, the ESC Cardiovascular Imaging Textbook, The EAE textbook of Echocardiography, were sold and publicized during the Congress from the ESC Stand. With 5 new ESC Clinical Practice Guidelines in 2013, ESC Pocket Guideline sales met expectations.

#### Other activities

Non-stand related activities included meetings with medical communications agencies, publishers, the HEART Group, Editorial Boards, Publications Committee and other ad hoc meetings.

Two key promotions occurred in relation to our publications:

**OUP/ESC Cardio-Zine**: An online magazine showcasing our **six** new ESC books and growing journal family was heavily promoted on the Stand and throughout the Congress centre. The Cardio-Zine is still accessible via this link: www.oup.com/esc14. The new books are: Intensive & Acute Cardiovascular Care (2<sup>nd</sup> edition), Cardiovascular Imaging (2<sup>nd</sup> edition), Preventive Cardiology – Clinical Practice, Echo Handbook, Handbook of Preventive Cardiology - Putting prevention into practice and The EHRA Book of Pacemaker, ICD, and CRT.





## EHJ: Cardiovascular Pharmacotherapy:

*EHJ - Cardiovascular Pharmacotherapy* is a new, ESC journal from the Working Group on Cardiovascular Pharmacology & Drug Therapy. The Journal is freely available online until December 2016 and aims to publish the highest quality research, interpreting and integrating new scientific developments within the field of cardiovascular pharmacotherapy. Approximately 9 000 attendees visited the Guidelines corner on the ESC Plaza.



This year the five 2014 Pocket Guidelines were made available for the ESC Congress both in paper format and in electronic format for iDevices and Androids.

The Guidelines Application gives access to the electronic version of all 2011-2014 ESC Pocket Guidelines (15 titles in total), as well as to over 55 dedicated interactive tools, all in one App.







Over 30 000 paper versions of the Pocket Guidelines (Hypertrophy Cardiomyopathy, Non-Cardiac Surgery, Myocardial Revascularization, Acute Pulmonary Embolism & Aortic Diseases) were given out to the ESC Members on a first come, first served basis.

The paper versions of these 2014 Pocket Guidelines were also distributed at the Cardiologists of Tomorrow (CoT) desk and in the VIP and Fellows lounges.

The Pocket Guidelines remained a successful tool for the dissemination of the ESC Guidelines Messages within the medical and cardiology community with more than 1 000 copies distributed per day throughout the congress.





## Meetings:

**9** Task Force meetings of 3 to 5 hours each, **1** Committee for Practice Guidelines Meeting and **5** other specific meetings were organised by the Guidelines Department alone or in conjunction with other ESC Departments. These meetings concerned Guidelines Development Task Forces and Committee, Implementation Teams, National Cardiac Societies (endorsements and translations of ESC Clinical Practice Guidelines) as well as many other topics.

We also aimed at familiarising visitors with the ESC Guidelines web pages and promoted the wide range of the ESC Guidelines derivative educational products.



The 2014 ESC Cardiology Quiz

The ESC Guidelines were highlighted and promoted during the **ESC Cardiology Quiz**. Delegations from three different renowned cardiology centres were in competition to correctly answer a series of questions and tests about different guidelines related topics. **Mainly driven by a didactic review of the ESC Guidelines**, the quiz focused on the most interesting, the most polemic or the most recently updated documents.

#### The Guidelines Team was also involved in the "Guidelines into Practice" Tracks.

## GiP

Multiple resources and presentations are made available in a simple click. This track is designed to guide cardiologists directly to valuable information from top experts to facilitate the implementation of the Guidelines into their daily practice.

Finally, the ESC Clinical Practice Guidelines were also very present in most social networks, with Guidelines presentations posted on "Youtube", numerous twitter messages highlighting the key Guidelines messages and activities, and more...

#### 2 174 Fellows of the ESC attended ESC Congress 2014, 5% more than last year.

#### • ESC Stand – Membership Area

110 applications for Fellowship and 3 for Nurse Fellowship were submitted during the Congress.

#### Fellows Lounge

On average 600 Fellows per day enjoyed the Fellows Lounge facilities and made the most of their privileges. The latest copies of ESC Clinical Practice Guidelines, copies of the ESC Journals and the daily issue of the ESC Congress News were available especially for them.

A plasma screen allowed viewing live hotline sessions. Catering and 14 computers were provided as well. This year, 3 silence sound armchairs were displayed.

Newly elected Fellows could collect their Fellowship Diploma, take a picture with their diploma and collect their FESC gift.

#### • Newly elected Fellows award

The 282 newly elected Fellows and 2 newly elected Nurse Fellows were invited to a cocktail and a special tribute was then given to them at the Inaugural Session on Saturday.

#### National Cardiac Societies Stands

**50 National Cardiac Societies** were represented. The stands were very well located in the ESC Plaza surrounding the ESC Stand and on the right side of the entrance of the Congress.

The National Cardiac Societies welcomed many national delegates and presented their activities by displaying posters and brochures on their stands.

#### Affiliated Cardiac Societies Display Stand

This year again, the Affiliated Cardiac Societies corner gave a great visibility to the **38** Affiliated Cardiac Societies. A lounge was set up allowing Affiliated Cardiac Societies to display their brochures, a poster, meet and network in the seating area.

**12 countries** were represented: Canada, Indonesia, Iran, Iraq, Macau, Malaysia, Oman, Singapore, South Africa, Sudan, Taiwan and Thailand.



A 60m<sup>2</sup> International Affairs stand was built in the plaza very close to the ESC stand and in the centre of the ESC International partner's area.

The objective of such a stand was to be a welcome point for the International delegates to allow them learn more about what ESC can do for them in a friendly and relaxed area.

A huge poster hung in the centre of the stand thanking all our International partners for their collaboration. Polaroid photos of delegates from Affiliated Cardiac Societies and beyond were pasted on a giant colourful map of the world.

Each photo was placed on the delegate's specific country creating an interactive map of our international audience.

# EXHIBITION, INDUSTRY SPONSORED SESSIONS, SPONSORSHIP & ADVERTISEMENT

Industry was very active at ESC Congress 2014 occupying 8 384.50 m<sup>2</sup> of space including 23 first time exhibitors, organising over 70 sessions and supporting multiple delegate products and services.

#### Exhibition

At the ESC Congress 2014 in Barcelona, the Exhibition Area occupied a total of 10 368.50 m<sup>2</sup> for 210 exhibit spaces and was concentrated in Exhibition Hall (Hall 3), and ESC Plaza (Hall 2).

The Exhibition Hall (Hall 3) was dedicated to the commercial exhibitors with our Industry Partners' stands, Publishers and ETSA area. Centrally located, the Exhibition was in between 2 villages (Village 1 & 9) and on the passageway to access 7 of the 9 villages (Village 2 to 8).

Hands-on-Tutorials rooms, Exhibition Lounges and CPR Workshops stand were located in Hall 3 as well.

The non commercial area, ESC Plaza, was located in Hall 2. In addition to the ESC Plaza, this hall was dedicated to the Registration area, the Hub (4 open lecture rooms), Barcelona Lecture Room (Plenary Room), Brussels Lecture Room (Focus lecture room) and Poster Area.

The ESC Plaza was dedicated to the National Cardiac Societies, ESC stand, International Associations and ESC International Affairs. The History of Cardiology stand, the European Heart Agency of the ESC as well as the European Heart for Children stands were also located in the ESC Plaza.















## Space Used for Stands (m<sup>2</sup>)


## **ESC Initiatives**

#### History of Cardiology - ESC Plaza (B500)

The History of Cardiology was organised for the third time at ESC Congress and enjoyed an excellent location within the ESC Plaza, which was undoubtedly one of the reasons for its great success.

Berndt Lüderitz and Jean-Jacques Monsuez, on behalf of the German and French Societies of Cardiology respectively, organised the exhibition of History of Cardiology at the ESC Congress in Barcelona with the logistical support of the ESC.

This year an open stand was created next to the posters area including properly-sized showcases in large numbers and useful logistic supports (computer, screen, microphone etc.).





This year's new location resulted to a large extent in the increasing success the exhibition encountered this year. The visitors clearly recognised the exhibition as an ESC's new field of interest. This was further supported by the announcement of the exhibition in the programme of the congress. The initiative was also communicated via different support such as the mobile app, ESC website and information screen onsite.

The attendance was excellent. Among the many scientists who visited the booth many young cardiologists from around the world visited the exhibition as well. Not only cardiologists from European countries, but also many from Japan, China, Taiwan, Korea, Brazil, Argentina, Chile, United Arabian Emirates, Russia, Iran, Azerbaijan, Pakistan, and Mongolia (as per comments on the guests' book available on the stand). A few cardiologists from the USA, including members of the ACC and HRA manifested interest for this ESC's initiative.

Visitors may be divided into 2 groups. Those who look at the showcases around while walking along the stand and others who stay for a longer time for an "in depth visit". Whereas the former were as many as in Amsterdam, both Berndt Lüderitz and Jean-Jacques Monsuez got the feeling that the later were in increased numbers, compared to last year. The mini-conferences by Berndt Lüderitz received quite enthusiastic attention among those visitors, who also asked for additional information on the collectibles and books on display.




According to the growing interest of visitors, the exhibition to follow should be adapted into several ways:

 Contributions of other national societies should be included. In Barcelona, Berndt Lüderitz and Jean-Jacques Monsuez were informed the Austrian Society of Cardiology wants to take place along with the active participation of Pr Otmar Pachinger. To fulfil the visitors' expectancies, the exhibition should target the 2 groups of aforementioned participants by combining overall display for an easy overview and a more focused approach for visitors looking for in depth information. Scheduling specific presentations in the history programme might be helpful in that way, e.g. as follows: "Saturday 30 August. 10-10:45: Art and the heart, B Lüderitz. Sunday August, 31: 10-10:45: How were valvular heart diseases discovered?, JJ Monsuez, etc etc. In addition, this may allow including a broader spectrum of contributors in the congresses to follow.

• Founding something as an ESC's club for history of cardiology and/or an "e-museum for history of cardiology", as the poster displayed on the booth suggested, may also be discussed in the future.









#### Cardiopulmonary Resuscitation (CPR) Workshops - Exhibition Area (G500)

The CPR Workshops were organised for the third time at ESC Congress and enjoyed an excellent location, which was undoubtedly one of the reasons for their great success.

The same set up as previous editions was reconvened, with an open air forum for an audience of 35, 7 closed windowed workshops rooms, a storage area and a space for the ERC stand, our partner in the initiative.

- Advanced CPR Skills Workshop: 11:30-13:00 & 16:30-18:00






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The workshops were very popular with a record attendance of 322 participants and over 50% of the participants went to both types of workshop.

Workshops were very popular to the younger generation and the ratio female to male is much higher than for the attendance to the ESC Congress.



#### **CME accreditation by EBAC**

The European Board for Accreditation in Cardiology provides accreditation to educational programme such as events and distance learning courses. EBAC is an independent body constituted by European specialists in cardiology and medical education. EBAC accreditation confirms the scientific & educational quality of a programme, and allows the participants to receive CME credits for the time spent in the educational activity.



- Press came third in the top five most visited sections of escardio.org during congress time.
- Press book on USB key with embargoed press releases and useful data and figures.
- ➔ Media training sessions: global brief + individual brief at the start of each press conference (chairpersons/speakers/spokespersons) + individual brief for specific issues handled by ESC Leadership (non cardiac surgery guidelines, ivabradine/SIGNIFY etc).
- ➔ Web pages featuring all releases including pictures from speakers and spokespersons, links to slides and webcasted press conferences.

#### 2014 specific

- Crisis communications agency was brought in to handle potential "attacks" from journalists and media train ESC leadership to handle journalists in the best possible way this proved useful and successful.
- Outstanding local press coverage thanks to excellent Spanish agency, used for third time (1 111 clippings including 47 TV, 35 Radio, 159 printed Media and 870 Online Media) reaching an audience of 196 million with a publicity value of € 2.7 million (very high due to TV at peak time).
- Outstanding international coverage: 4 198 articles reaching a publicity value of €2 million. The additional choice of lay materials (wine, tea, energy drinks, fruit etc) not presented in a press conference but added as stand-alone press releases proved very successful both in terms of coverage and website clicks. As expected hotlines got the most coverage overall and were the most clicked on links on escardio.org the big stories being PARADIGM (No. 1 by far), ODYSSEY, NECTAR, FOCUS, SIGNIFY and CULPRIT.
- Hotline press release writing and obtaining data still difficult for the hotline writer, too many authors decline to cooperate or send industry press release in an attempt to get rid of ESC science writer but she managed her mission.
- Hotline slides very challenging to obtain for press office, all very last minute or on-site, lots of chasing needed.
- One more hotline press conference had to be added on Saturday lunchtime vs. the session held on Sunday morning as there was no other possible way to programme it later – this could have created embargo breaks, this unnecessarily penalised investigators whose studies were out in the public domain before the session was held and created confusion among journalists who were happy to have access to advance study results but failed to understand the rationale behind this decision and questioned it repetitively. We should have warned/explained this situation ahead of the congress. This together with the cancelled SIGNIFY press conference raised a lot of questions. We feel that ESC Press Office and scientific department/CPC should work closely on this important schedule and any drastic changes next year to ensure a smooth delivery of the press programme and any such changes should be communicated early to the media attending.
- Journals simultaneous publishing issue still difficult to get a hold of the info in advance, journalists still nervous about embargo breaks despite ESC press office repeated attempts to make things as clear as possible – need to work even closer with key publishers
- Press zone very well lit with natural day light, not quite enough seating space, good feedback on catering and press conference room overall.
- AV, IT and logistics overall worked well. A few wifi problems and 3 hostesses turned up 3 hours late on the most important registration day (Saturday).





Registration increasingly difficult for hostess to handle – too many exceptions to standard rules, too many industry and hidden marketing or PR, impossible to carry out full investigation during congress - we would highly recommend to hire a trainee to follow this important part of the job closely all summer + follow up by the same person on site. Without a close look at each individual registration, errors occur, our work ethics are questioned and we lose our credibility among genuine press.

## **ELECTRONIC COMMUNICATIONS**

### ESC Congress 2014 Mobile App



An upgraded version of the ESC Congress Mobile App (for iPhones, Android Phones, & iPad & Android tablets) was made available to all Congress delegates to disseminate ESC Congress scientific programme and general information easily to participants.

The mobile app contained:

- The entire scientific programme of the Congress (Synchronisation of the mobile app with ESC internal scientific programme software (SPM) for up to date scientific content),

- Direct links from the presentations to their resources (slides, webcasts, abstracts and reports)

- Congress maps,
- Congress general information & resources,
- ESC corporate information,
- Information about the sponsor (SERVIER),
- Daily news and notifications

It offered various functionalities to congress delegates like daily notifications pushed on their mobile devices, interactive maps to locate exhibitors and sessions rooms, sessions objectives, possibility for the user to consult the resources of the presentations (slides, webcasts, reports via ESC Congress 365) directly from the app, powerful search functionality throughout the congress scientific content, personalised programme with notifications of elements added in personal programme 15 minutes before the event, to do lists, to take notes of specific sessions and share these with colleagues. It helped provide more visibility/recognition to the sponsor and helped broaden the access to social networking platforms (direct link to the #ESCCongress Twitter feed), so as to eventually decrease the need for paper programmes on-site.

The mobile app was available on the App Store and on Google Play ('ESC 2014').

7 Mobile app stations were available throughout the congress centre and allowed delegates who did not bring their mobile device to consult the app on iPads.



- Download time optimisation: In order to improve users' satisfaction, the development of the app (bundled data and resubmission to the app) was optimised to decrease the download time (objective: app download + data download < 1 minute).</li>
- Voting & interaction functionalities in the "mobile app interactive sessions"
   A selection of sessions ("mobile app interactive sessions" track) were designed with interaction features through the mobile app:
  - "Ask a question" allowed delegates to send session/topic related questions to the chairperson during the session.
  - "**Voting**" allowed delegates to answer questions when prompted by the speaker during the session.
- A **tutorial video** was created to help users make the most of the ESC Congress app.

The tutorial video was divided into 8 chapters.

The tutorial video was available before and during the Congress on the web page of the ESC 2014 mobile app, as well as on the ESC YouTube page and on the app stations throughout the congress centre in Barcelona.

The app was available in stores on 18 July 2014 (6 weeks prior to ESC Congress).

The mobile app was downloaded **19 558 times (as of 29 September)** (+7% compared to 2013 with 18 263 downloads).

iPhones and iPads were largely used by our audience:

- 14 701 downloads (75%) on iOS devices,
- 4 857 downloads (25%) on Android.

19 558 downloads could represent 65% of all congress delegates (including press and exhibitors, 30 330 participants).

Thanks to intensive pre-marketing before the event, **57 %** (about 11 000) of the 19 558 downloads were performed before the Congress. This increased compared to last year: (44% in 2013 with 8 000 download before the congress)


Congress. This increased compared to last year: (44% in 2013 with 8 000 download before the congress) Pre-congress downloads helped significantly reduce the strain on the WIFI network during the congress and allowed delegates to prepare their congress attendance.

#### Users used the mobile app to:

- View a session, presentation, poster (85.5% of users)
- View the daily programme (80%)
- View topic, type, track or village (72.6%)
- Add items to 'My Congress' (71.1%)
- View floor plans (62%)
- Add items in "My Congress" (59 %)
- Add items in "My Programme" (53 %)
- Enter the search page (51%)
- View the ESC page (45.6%)
- Click on the SERVIER menu to view the SERVIER section (19 %)

### Also interesting to note:

- 43% of the users entered the list of announcements, and 28% clicked on an announcement, this is an important feature to maintain.
- After several years and with the tutorial video, more and more users now discover all the functionalities of the app with for example 994 users using the "My Notes" functionality.



### ESC Congress 365 – Your free access to ESC Congress content, all year long!

ESC Congress 365 provides free access to ESC Congress content (all abstracts, reports, slides, and webcasts for which ESC received copyright from the speakers and/or presenters) all year long, with the objective to:

- Capitalise on ESC Congress ٠ content value
- Provide educational content from ESC Congress to a wider, global audience
- Sustain scientific debate and interaction throughout the year
- Disseminate the best science to increase awareness and ultimately improve practices



In 2014, ESC Congress 365 has been supported by 5 sponsors (AstraZeneca, Bayer HealthCare, Boehringer Ingelheim, the Bristol-Myers Squibb and Pfizer alliance, and SERVIER) in the form of an unrestricted educational grant.



- 3 541 slide sets were published in ESC Congress 365 this year. (2 349 last year)
- 1 980 webcasts were published in 2014 last year we had 1 562 webcast
- 3 651 abstracts presented in the ESC Congress 365 this year. (3 290 were published in 2013)
- 325 reports were published in 2014 (last year we published 348 reports)



The offering in terms of scientific resources was more important this year and the use (consultation) of these resources keeps growing up year after year.

ESC Congress 365 benefits from an intensive promotion all year long leading to consultations all year long, however as one would expect there is a peak of consultations during ESC Congress when professionals look for hot scientific news. This high traffic on ESC Congress 365 continues for a few weeks post congress.

This is represented on the graph hereunder with a peak at the end of the Congress with more than 11 300 slide sets consulted. During ESC Congress, content is updated daily and new resources are added. The other peak on 10 September corresponds to the email campaign sent to thank ESC Congress attendees and to invite them to consult the ESC Congress 365 resources, Best of ESC Congress and other resources available.





### Definition

### ESC TV Cardio Talk:

Interviews of cardiologists by cardiologists.

Cardio Talk was sub-contracted to *mediAVentures*. The videos were shot in real TV studio conditions by a full team of professionals.

In total, 49 interviews were filmed throughout 4 days, 22 of which were published during or straight after the ESC Congress, because the content was directly linked to the ESC Congress.

### NEW

- ESC Congress Late Breaking Science interviews filmed on a face-to-face format (previously "round-table" which proved inadequate) the slots allocated to Late Breaking Science have gone from 3 to 10!
- Interviews with ESC Affiliated Cardiac Societies: Brazil, China and India. The presidents
  of our partner societies have been invited on the studio to be interviewed by ESC KOLs.
  The objective is to promote the joint activities of both associations: what are the current
  and future projects of collaboration? For better dissemination in its home country, the
  interview with the Brazilian Society of Cardiology was conducted in Portuguese, available
  also with English subtitles. The interviews with the Chinese and Indian societies were
  conducted in English with subtitles in option.
- Interview dedicated to the ESC Registries
- **Cardiologists of Tomorrow interviews** now focus on scientific topics of specific interest to their community (previously the format was: a COT interviews a KOL on their career).
- **Promotion of ESC Congress 2015**: the 2014 and 2015 topic coordinators discuss the biggest hits in their village and what is to be expected next year in London

### • ESC TV – Congress by Day: 4 published videos

Video reports of what happened at the ESC Congress on the previous day. 4 Daily editions, published during the ESC Congress.

ESC Congress by day was sub-contracted to *Medical Productions*. The videos were shot by a team of professional video production. The team roamed throughout the congress centre, to get the real "look & feel" of the ESC Congress.




Most of the sessions streamed live from 8:00 to 20:00 were also available from 20:00 to 08:00 as webcasts amongst other ACS joint sessions.

### > Videos

77 videos related to the ESC Congress were published.

The most successful video during congress was "ESC Congress 2014: The place to be". The most successful video after the congress was the recording of "Best of ESC Congress 2014".

The promotion of ESC TV on the website homepage, the Congress Home page, in ESC Congress 365, on Facebook, Twitter as well as in the Daily Congress News e-campaigns has resulted in a larger number than normal of views during the congress.

### Social Media

This year, the activity on Social Media was astonishingly high, especially due to an increase of the activity on Facebook compared to previous year.

We used Social Media to promote and broadcast information about new features, main sessions, ESC Congress 365, Congress reports, Best of ESC, ... For the first time, we also provided a better and larger visibility to all constituent bodies of the ESC, promoting their products and initiatives as well as their membership.

This year, we noted a lot more interaction with our delegates. They didn't hesitate to ask us direct questions and post comments about their congress experience.

During the congress (30 Aug to 4 Sept, including Best of Online Event)

- 955 messages were sent via our official accounts (ESC web team + live reporter)
- 22 400 unique users created 43 196 interactions with our official accounts
- Almost **30 millions of people** who potentially saw our postings and tweets, on our own profile and page or due to retweets and stories created on Facebook by our "fans".

### <u>Key highlights</u>

- Our total reach is twice larger than last year's
- Significant increase on Facebook activity this year : 2,5 times more postings, 10 times more stories created from our audience (also due to a larger audience, 3,5 times larger in 2014 than in 2013)
- +33% retweets, twice more mentions
- We gained 5 times more new followers and new Facebook page likes compared to last year
- Almost 8 times more unique users on Facebook and twitter

### Activities

The two social media platforms, Facebook and Twitter, were used for different and specific purposes:

- Twitter: Mostly used to relay scientific information, including live tweeting, as well as press information. The idea was to digitally broadcast what was happening at the ESC Congress inside the session rooms and with a scientific perspective.
- Facebook: Mostly used to relay promotional and general information as well as pictures and messages about what was happening in the congress hallways. Tone of voice was much more informal and we saw many users engaged in, and even launched, conversations on postings.

Extensive promotion of the hashtag #ESCcongress was done ahead and during the Congress.

### Live tweeting

For the third year in a row, a reporter tweeted LIVE from the sessions. A group of Dutch medical students was also involved in this process and encouraged to retweet our messages and raise awareness about the Congress on Twitter.

### **Users interactions**

This year, we noted a lot more interaction with our delegates. They didn't hesitate to ask us direct questions and post comments about their congress experience.



Comparison with the 2013 traffic:

- Call for abstracts: important increase (+439% visits & + 33% page views) compared to 2013.
- Advance Programme: increase in visits (+37%) & page views (+149%)
- Final Programme: small decrease (as there were many more paper copies printed this year) but still very good figures of the online version

### Promotion barter agreements

In order to extend the reach of ESC Congress promotion to new audiences, promotional barter agreements were set up with:

- Congress organisers/medical associations
- Medical & scientific Publishers (e.g. BIBA MEDICAL, DIEurope Itd, European Hospital, Scientific American, KARGER, Radcliffe Cardiology, SCHATTAUER).

This led to:

- The shipment of ESC promotional documents to 59 medical congresses (for insertion in the delegates' bags or display on the future meetings tables) in addition to the promotion that takes places at ESC Congresses & events and at ESC NCS & ACS meetings.
- The publication of 100 ESC Congress 2014 advertisements in 30 different journals (43 ads in non-ESC journals 57 in ESC journals).

In addition, many congress organisers and publishers have displayed ESC Congress 2014 promotional banners on their web sites all year long.

In exchange, most of the publishers and congress organisers were offered free display of their journals/flyers on the future meetings table and/or on the premium publisher's information tables.

### **Premium Publishers Information tables**

Similar to 2013, in order to increase the number of free advertisements to promote ESC Congress 2014 all year long, selected publishers (13) were offered the opportunity to display their publications on the Premium Publishers Information tables. These tables were located at a high traffic location (in the sitting area, between the Exhibition hall and Villages 2-3-4-5-6-7 & 8, after a security check where congress badges are required versus the future meetings table) which improved their journals visibility while providing quality service to delegates (access to free marketing copies of medical journals in the cardiology fields which may be of interest to them).



This concept was very well perceived: more than 7 500 copies were distributed.

ESC journals were predominantly promoted at this key location with a large visual above all the brochures racks and a QR code linking to the ESC journal offering.

### NEW Future Meetings table

The future meetings table was located at the entrance of the congress centre (no badge required). The objective of this table was to offer additional visibility to ESC Congress and ESC subspecialty congresses while giving other congress organisers some visibility by displaying their brochures and posters. On their way out of the congress centre, healthcare professionals could collect all flyers of future medical congresses at one stop.

ESC Congress & events (ESC Congress, ESC sub-specialty congresses & GSA events) and the meeting of the Spanish Society of Cardiology were given more visibility with large posters directly printed on the wall above all the brochures.



From ESC Congress 2010 to 2013, a quantitative market research has been conducted on-site by an independent market research agency (Shift Learning), with the objective of measuring delegates' satisfaction with ESC Congress. This has allowed us to benchmark survey responses over a 3 year period, of which one of the valuable learnings has been that the results have been consistent. It was then determined that the scope of this year's market research be shifted to develop new learnings based on participant needs that would support the evolution of ESC Congress and ESC Congress derivative products and support their business objectives.

To achieve this, the following ESC Congress key stakeholders were interviewed:

- CEO / Acting Congress Director / Acting Scientific Affairs Director
- Congress Division: Congress Management, Scientific Programme, Industry Relations, Delegate Services, Congress Marketing and Communications
- Communications Division
- Current and Future Congress Programme Committee Chairpersons: Professors Keith Fox and Genevieve Derumeaux

As a result of these interviews, the Market research was designed to cover the following:

- To understand the ESC Congress delegates' experience, needs and perception of the value derived
- To understand the ESC derivative product user experience, needs and perception of the value derived from these products

To achieve these goals, the market research is being conducted in 2 phases:

# Phase 1: Congress participant qualitative in-depth interviews conducted on-site in Barcelona, covering the Congress experience and the interaction of derivative products in the Congress experience, the objectives being:

- Understand delegates' value perception of ESC Congress (ROI)
- Understand the different target audiences and their needs relative to scientific content, information, learning and translation into practice
- Understand delegates' Congress experience and on-site special needs (professional and personal)
- Understand delegates' digital needs (before, during, and after the Congress)
- Understand delegates' need for Congress printed materials

# Phase 2: Congress participant and non-participant qualitative in-depth interviews conducted post-Congress by phone and quantitative survey covering derivative products with the objectives:

- How do these products complement and enhance the value of Congress? How is used pre at and after Congress and when, and for how long after Congress and for what purpose? Do delegates expect or need a digital congress?
- Understand how the user obtains value from these products? (Why they use it) The purpose? Is it used for teaching, preparing a presentation, preparing a literature review? Is it shared with colleagues?
- How to improve the value that the user could receive from these products? (unique value compare to other competitive products)
- How can the user experience of these products be improved?
- Would you recommend the product/have you? Do they share it? How do they share it?

## **BEST OF ESC CONGRESS**

### Presentation

The Best of ESC Congress 2014 live interactive event is a TV talk show broadcast on internet one day after ESC Congress 2014: **Thursday 4 September 2014 from 20:00 to 21:00 (CET)**.

This programme, organised for the fourth year in a row, presented the main news with clinical relevance and latest updates from the congress through a series of short video reports, snapshots and panel discussion.

The live recording, run by a full team of professionals in real TV studio conditions, took place within the Entrance Hall of the Congress Venue 1 day post-congress as opposed to 8 days in the previous years.

The programme was hosted by Professor **Keith AA Fox, FESC** Chairperson of the ESC Congress Programme Committee 2012 - 2014 and Professor **Barbara Casadei, FESC**, who moderated the discussions with a panel of international experts:



## HOTELS AND SOCIAL EVENTS

### **Hotel Accommodation**

Barceló Congresos was our Official Local Agent. We had a very good cooperation and collaboration during the preparation phase and onsite. The staff was very professional and we encountered no over bookings. We received no complaints from our industry partners regarding the management of their rooming lists once the process was taken over by our local agent. The European Federation for pharmaceutical companies (EFPIA) uses a traffic light system (coding green, orange or red) to advise their members on congress compliance in the matter of hospitality, scientific programme etc. They raised concern about the ESC offering of a 5\* hotel category to delegates which is discouraged under their code. No industry groups took this hotel category, the ESC kept this hotel category in its offer for individuals; no other complaints or concerns were raised.

Arts Hotel was our HQ hotel and accommodated the ESC Board, Past Presidents, Gold Medalists, Named Lectures and other VIPs. The hotel standards were appreciated by the delegates in spite of tough negotiations and a hard preparation phase.

A number of conference rooms were booked for ESC meetings mainly held on Friday. Our last minute changes and requests were handled in a timely manner.



Arts Hotel

The Porta Fira Hotal was our co-HQ hotel located opposite the Fira congress venue (2 minute walking distance) and accommodated the CPC members.

ESC Hotel Accommodation represented a total of 12 528 rooms booked for the core period and generating a total of **61 816 room nights** divided as follows:

- 5\*: **1 838 rooms**
- 4\* : 9 053 rooms
- 3\* : **1 571 rooms**
- 2\*: 66 rooms

Gastro Fira was the official Caterer for the Congress. We experienced a very good collaboration with the staff in the preparation phase and during the event. They were very pro-active onsite and always managed to adjust to our last minute needs and requirements. We can also underline that the catering costs, when compared with some of our previous destinations, were very reasonable.

Some of the main areas of catering needs:

**Lounges:** VIP Lounge, Fellows Lounge, Industry & CRT Lounge, Focus Lounge, SSC Lounge. Adequate catering was ordered and no problems encountered.

**Inaugural Session – Networking Cocktail:** The new format put in place since last year again turned out to be effective. This cocktail was divided in two parts:

- First part prior to the Inaugural Session with only drinks served for 2 500 persons in the Exhibition halls and ESC Plaza.
- Second part after the Inaugural Session with drinks and canapés served for 1 000 persons only in the ESC Plaza. The quantity of drinks and canapés was sufficient.

**ESC General Assembly**: New format this year with a morning session instead of a "lunch session". A coffee break station was placed at main entrance of the room. No problems encountered.

All quantities for our catering needs were sufficient except for the **Press** coffee breaks. The quantity was based on 200 persons per day for the 4 congress days: the quantity needed to be slightly adjusted onsite.

The quantity for lunches based on 200 persons was adequate. We received very positive feedbacks regarding the quality of the food and the regular cleaning of the catering area.







Free Wi-Fi was provided all over the venue for participants, including an exhibition space (which was new this year). We used Fira Barcelona's permanent Wi-Fi infrastructure.

Maximum users peak was **12 644 users at a time** (Monday 3<sup>rd</sup> September at around 12h00) and max traffic peak was **332 Mbps** download and **170 Mbps** upload on SSID 'esc-congress':



There was a total of **30 064** unique devices connected over 5 days. For information, half of these devices were **iPhones/iPads** (15134):



### Wi-Fi for exhibitors:

Free Wi-Fi to participants was provided in the exhibition halls, which needed specific technical arrangements, but due to Wi-Fi radio technology limitations, we had essentially to focus on rules and communication to improve global availability in that area. We put in place several actions:

- A new Wi-Fi policy was written together with Fira Barcelona
- On Venue order form, exhibitors had to declare if they brought their own Wi-Fi network devices, and in such a case, they had to fill in specific "technical" fields;
- ESC reinforced the new Wi-Fi policy with dedicated communication to exhibitors;
- On-site inspection was put in place to apply the policy (dedicated channels, signal strength);

### Self Printing (badges and certificates) & Self Registration

This year again, participants had the possibility to self-register on site through **4** self registration stations at the main registration desk, and they could print their badge/certificate on site on **12** self badge/certificate printing stations by scanning their voucher (to print a badge) or their badge (to print a certificate) with a new "flat" scanner ('Datalogic Magellan'):
