1. GENERAL INFORMATION

1.1 Introduction

Every year the European Association for Cardiovascular Prevention & Rehabilitation (EACPR) hosts a congress on preventive cardiology and the importance of the prevention of cardiovascular disease. This congress, called EuroPRevent, is the premiere international forum where leading experts from all the scientific fields in cardiology get together to discuss strategies for a universal approach towards the prevention of cardiovascular disease. EuroPRevent is a far reaching congress attracting a wide variety of cardiology professionals from more than 80 countries every year.

1.2 EACPR @ EuroPRevent

- The Global Forum on CVD Prevention in Clinical Practice, targeted at elected Leadership of professional societies with an interest in prevention and rehabilitation in clinical practice, National Coordinators for CVD Prevention, National Cardiac Societies, National Heart Foundations and EuroPRevent Delegates gathered over 100 participants for both afternoon sessions. - The **EACPR General Assembly** was attended by 75 members and resulted in the adoption of the revised EACPR constitution. **I Read the** <u>PDF</u>
- The National CVD Prevention Coordinators workshop gathered 24 participants, representing 19 countries to discuss implementation strategies, best practices and national programmes.
- **138 New members** joined EACPR during the congress.
- Demos of CVD Prevention tools (HeartScore / Guideline Learning Tool / Toolkits) and ESCeL were offered to delegates on the ESC / EACPR stand.
- The **EACPR Members Lounge** -which offers networking opportunities for EACPR members welcomed 224 visitors on Thursday 18 April and 287 visitors on Friday 19 April.




Layout with room capacities



Average ratings graph:










