RESTRICTIONS

- All PCs in the SSC and the lecture rooms will run Windows XP and Office 2003.
- Personal laptop computers **cannot be connected** to the projectors in lecture rooms.
- Presentations cannot be loaded directly on the computer in the lecture rooms.
- Maximum size of presentation should not exceed 256 MB.

In the lecture room, as soon as your presentation is launched by the technician, you can easily follow it on a monitor at the lectern and control it directly with a mouse.

We strongly recommend the use of the mouse pointer, instead of any laser pointer.

Chairpersons will easily follow the presentations on a dedicated monitor.
